Who is responsible for what, when and where? Simple process rules help to avoid dangerous situations right from the start. Actively involve employees in the design of processes.

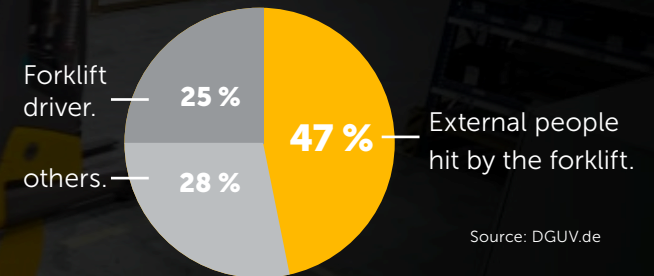
In this way, you can use everyday experience to identify and eliminate sources of danger.
